

RECYCLING GUIDE



Collections in Hertsmere

We collect from your property on the same day every week and we encourage you to recycle as much of your waste as possible.

Every house should have: • a brown bin for mixed recycling

· a black bin for non-recyclables

If you subscribe to our garden waste collection service you will also have a green bin.



On Week 2 we will collect green and brown bins



Please present your bin on the boundary of your property by 6am on collection day. You can find out which week it is by visiting www.hertsmere.gov.uk/BinCollections

Black bin

Use this bin for waste that cannot go in your recycling bins.

The black bin is for general waste but there are still some items that are not acceptable including: batteries, vapes/e-cigarettes and electrical items, paint/paint containers, soil, gas cylinders and DIY waste such as bricks, rubble, asbestos and plasterboard.

You can take these items to your local Recycling Centre - see our FAQs on the back page for information on extra waste. Asbestos and other hazardous items may need specialist removal.

IMPORTANT

Hot ash in the back of our vehicles can lead to a fire. Please allow all fire/BBQ ash to cool completely before putting in your black bin.



Mixed recycling bin (brown bin)

Use this bin to recycle glass, cartons, plastic, cans, cardboard and paper.

If recycling bins contain the wrong items they will not be emptied. Please only put acceptable items in and 'if in doubt. leave it out!'

IMPORTANT

Items must be:

· Loose, not bagged

If you are using a bag to carry your recyclables to the bin please empty the items into the recycling bin first, then dispose of the bag in the general waste bin or reuse it.

Clean and empty

Please rinse off any food residue. Pizza boxes, dirty foil and any other food containers with food stuck to them are not acceptable.

FAQs

My bin wasn't collected, what should I do?

There may be a reason your bin hasn't been collected, e.g. due to contamination or being overloaded. If your bin hasn't been collected by 2pm please call Customer Services on 020 8207 7480 to report it. You must report a missed bin within two working days.

I have extra waste, what can I do with it?

Recycling centres are available for any additional waste and recycling that won't fit in the bins. They can be found at a number of locations across Hertfordshire, including:

- · Cranborne Road, Potters Bar, EN6 3JE
- · Allum Lane, Elstree, WD6 3NN
- Waterdale, St Albans Road (near Garston), WD25 OPR

These are managed by Hertfordshire County Council and details of opening times can be found at www. hertfordshire.gov.uk/recycling

Please note, we will not remove anything left on top of or next to your bins.

I don't have a green bin subscription so I have to put my food waste in the black bin, is there anything I can do to reduce the amount of food I throw away?
