Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

There shall be no alteration of the rules of the club relating to the sale of alcohol without the consent of the Licensing Authority.

All embedded restrictions and conditions inherent in the Licensing Act 1964.

Where a programme includes a film in the 12A, 15 or 18 category of the British Board of Film Classification, no person appearing to be under the age of 12 (and unaccompanied in that case), 15 or 18 as appropriate shall be admitted to any part of the programme; and the licence holder shall display in a conspicuous position a notice in the following terms: -

Persons under the age of (insert appropriate age) cannot be admitted to any part of the programme.

Where films of different categories form part of the same programme, the notice shall refer to the oldest age restriction. This condition does not apply to members of staff under the relevant age while on duty provided that the prior written consent of the person's parents or legal guardian has first been obtained.

1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The gates must be kept locked and shutters down when premises are not in use.

Alarm system and perimeter lights must be maintained and in full working order.

Fire exits and extinguishers must be clearly marked and in full working order.

Health and Safety and first aid signs must be clearly visible.

To persons thought to be under the age of 18, I.D must be required and if not provided or in any doubt of the I.D then the service of alcohol must be refused.

To persons thought to be under the age of 18 are not permitted on the premises on any adult functions.

The clubs managers and youth club staff must be criminal background checked by the Police.

Doors and windows to be kept closed during busy / noisy nights.

The area around the premises must be kept tidy.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by licensing authority

1. Ingress and egress notwithstanding, all external doors and windows to the premises are to be kept closed during any regulated entertainment.
2. All external doors are to be fitted with automatic door closers and fitted with alarms when door is open during regulated entertainment. Where an external door is served by a lobby, the door closer may be fitted to the internal lobby door.
3. Amplified music and/or speech external to the premises is not permitted.
4. Prominent, clear and legible notices are to be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
5. The tipping of bottles into receptacles external to the premises must not take place between 19:00 and 09:00 hours.
6. Only toughened glass (for drinking) is to be provided for use on the premises.
7. The use of areas external to the premises, other than the canopied area, is not permitted for the consumption of alcohol, other refreshment or food.
8. Ventilation ducts through external walls facing noise-sensitive premises within 100 metres must be acoustically treated.
9. All external doors are to be fitted with acoustic seals and threshold strips.
10. Loudspeakers used for regulated entertainment (other than background music) that are mounted on walls of ceilings must be acoustically isolated from the building structure.
11. A Noise limiting device is to be used for regulated entertainment that involves amplified music and/or amplified voice. Such device to be set after consultation and agreement with Environmental Health. The device is to be fitted as soon as possible but in any event not later than 3 months from the date of this hearing.
12. Noise from regulated entertainment should not be audible from the boundary of any noise sensitive premises.
13. A member of the clubs committee to supervise guests departing from the premises.
14. Children must be inside the premises by 20:30 hours.
15. Club members and guests must vacate the premises 30 minutes after the sale of alcohol ceases except for committee members and staff who need to remain to clean/tidy the premises.
