Proposed Amendments to Gambling Policy Statement of Principles

Page 4 – Part A – Introduction and Declaration

From 4th paragraph: The Gambling Act 2005 requires that the following parties are consulted by licensing authorities:

- The Chief Officer of Police;
- One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons carrying on gambling businesses in the authority's area; and
- One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons who are likely to be affected by the exercise of the authority's functions under the Gambling Act 2005.

A full list of those persons/organisations consulted is provided in full in the attached Appendix A.

This latest draft of the policy contains the minimum of amendments and no changes to the intent or direction of the policy. Due to the fact that it contains such minor amendments, consultation on this occasion has been limited to the responsible authorities and public for a limited period of 4 weeks between 19 January 2015 and 16 February 2015.
