#### Introduction

Studio Way Woodland Trail & Potterswood Park is located in a residential area on the north eastern edge of Borehamwood. It consists of a green corridor linking Rowley Lane with Shenley Road and returns south east towards Studio Way, to which it links via an alleyway. It is split into three roughly equal sections by Balcon Way and Denham Way. In total it covers 5.8 hectares and is approximately 1 km in length.

The landscape of Studio Way Woodland Trail & Potterswood Park has developed over many years, yet some of the original field boundary hedges, woodland and veteran Oak trees still survive on the site.

The eastern section of Studio Way contains well established mature woodland and is part of a long strip of common land known as Waste at Rowley Lane, which has been incorporated into the open space. The wood is predominately of oak with occasional ash and poplar. The understorey consists of a mixture of hawthorn, blackthorn plus occasional Elder, Holly, Cherry Laurel and Hazel. Along the edge of the unsurfaced path the ground flora contains good numbers of bluebell and lesser stitchwort, while beyond this bramble dominates.

Along the surfaced path edges remnants of hedgerow and associated bank and ditch are evident and a small brook enters from a culvert at the southeastern end and runs north through the site.

In the 1950's, when the local area was used as a filming location large numbers of Poplar trees were planted and now dominate some of the woodland areas. Much of the central part of Studio Way Woodland contains poplars, many of which are approaching maturity. The eastern block has a mixed understorey containing, rowan, Norway maple, horse chestnut, wild service, hawthorn, cherry and hazel. The western block in contrast has a dense understorey of hawthorn and blackthorn. The ground flora is predominantly bramble cow parsley and cleavers.

With the subsequent construction of neighbouring housing, work has had to be carried out in recent years to remove some of the large Poplars, particularly those close to people's houses. The work is essential to prevent damage to neighbouring properties from subsidence and to reduce the risk from falling trees and branches.

As a result work has been carried out to revert much of the site to native broadleaved woodland, an area of trees which links the two blocks of poplars was planted approximately ten years ago and is now establishing well.

The final area of woodland occupies the south western section of the open space and continues the green corridor from Shenley Road to the south east. This consists of occasional mature oak and ash and a mixture of birch, poplar, horse chestnut, field maple, hazel, hawthorn and blackthorn. The canopy is relatively open and the ground flora consists of cow parsley, bramble and nettles. Beyond this woodland near the southern limit of the open space a small area of rough grassland remains.

Potterswood Park on the northern edge of Studio Way Woodland trail is more open with areas of amenity grass, parkland and wooded copses. The park has recently had a facelift, with two football goal units, a challenging multi-play area and basket swing being installed.

There is a network of footpaths through the site; some are tarmaced and maintained by Hertfordshire County Council, and others are less formal, with a grassed surface and are

maintained by Hertsmere Borough Council. A woodland trail has previously been established through the site.


#### **Community Engagement**

Effective community engagement is at the centre of a successful Management Plan. Their particular value as documents comes from balancing the thoughts and aspirations of users and interested groups throughout the writing process.

During the production of the Studio Way Woodland Trail & Potterswood Park Management Plan stakeholders and interested groups had two opportunities to feed into the production of the new plan.

During the first stage, people were invited to make comment on the key objectives and outline actions put forward in a briefing document and further objectives and/or issues were addressed through this information gathering process. To support this stage, a guided walk was held on site on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2014. The walk was widely publicized with posters on site, information forwarded to local community organisations and a press release to local media. Eight members of the local community attended and had the opportunity to find out about the wildlife and heritage of the site and the future plans for management.

For the second stage, people will be invited to read through and make comment on the draft Management Plan. Following this exercise, the final document will be produced and published. The following diagram shows the Management Plan production process which was issued to consultees.



#### Vision

To maintain Studio Way Woodland Trail as a inviting and safe green corridor for recreation, wildlife and the appreciation of local history.

- 3. Involve the community in the development of Studio Way Woodland Trail & Potterswood Park

- 5. Maintain Studio Way as a clean, well maintained, safe and secure open space
- 6. Secure funding to support site improvement works

#### **Action Plan**

The following action plan has been established to achieve the objectives set out the Management Plan. The plans are comprised of annual work programmes, which address management activity that falls outside of the contracted grounds maintenance operations. They cover the period from April 2014 to March 2019 inclusive. In some cases, tasks are ongoing and so appear on more than one action plan.

Column 1 and 2 of the action plan lists the management objective for each particular task. In some instances, an objective will be fulfilled by a number of actions. Column 3 briefly describes the action with further information provided in an external document of specifications, referenced in Column 4.

Column 5 sets out the organisation/s responsible for delivery of the stated action (see list of abbreviations below), and Column 6 gives an estimated cost for carrying out the works.


