THE M1 MOTORWAY JUNCTIONS 1 - 4 TEMPORARY OVERNIGHT SLIP ROAD CLOSURES

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order on the M1 Motorway, in the London Borough of Barnet, under section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 because works are proposed to be executed on the road.

The effect of the Order is to authorise the overnight closure of the following slip roads:

- (a) the roads leading from the eastbound carriageway and the westbound carriageway of the A406 (North Circular Road) to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 1;
- (b) the road leading from the A1 (Great North Way) to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 2;
- (c) the road leading from the southbound carriageway of the M1 to the A1 (Great North Way) at Junction 2;
- (d) the roads leading from the northbound carriageway of the M1 or to the southbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 3; Gateway Services at Junction 3;
- (e) the roads leading from the southbound carriageway of the M1 or to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 3; Gateway Services at Junction 3;
- (f) the road leading from the A41 (Edgware Way) to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 4; and
- (g) the road leading from the southbound carriageway of the M1 to the A41 (Edgware Way) at Junction 4.

These measures are in the interests of road safety to enable contractors to undertake cyclic maintenance and/or urgent repair work.

It is expected that the work will take place for approximately 1 - 2 nights for each slip road every two months between 22:00 and 05:30 on Monday - Thursday nights, 23:00 and 06:00 on Friday nights, 22:00 and 06:00 on Saturday nights and 22:30 and 05:30 on Sunday nights.

The Order will come into force on 1 April 2012 and have a maximum duration of twelve months.

During the closures outlined at (a) above, eastbound traffic will be diverted via the roundabout at Staples Corner to use the slip road from the westbound carriageway of the A406 to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 1; westbound traffic will be diverted via the roundabout at Staples Corner to use the slip road from the eastbound carriageway of the A406 to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 1. During the closure outlined at (b) above, traffic affected will be diverted north on the A1 (Watford Way) and east and north on the A41 (Edgware Way) to join the M1 at Junction 4. During the closure outlined at (c) above, traffic affected will be diverted to continue south on the M1 to Junction 1 and east on the A406 (North Circular Road) to join the A1.

During the closures outlined at (d) above, traffic affected will be diverted north on the M1 to Junction 5 (A41/A406) and return south on the M1 to London Gateway Services. During the closures outlined at (e) above, traffic affected will be diverted south on the M1 to Junction 1 and return north on the M1 to London Gateway Services. During the closure outlined at (f) above, traffic affected will be diverted north on the A41 to Berrygrove interchange (A4008 - Stephenson Way) and join the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 5; during the closure outlined at (g) above, traffic affected will follow the same diversion route in the reverse direction.

The slip road closures and diversion routes will be clearly indicated by traffic signs throughout the works periods.

Watford Borough Council Notice of Submission of Watford's Local Development Framework Core Strategy for independent examination

Watford Borough Council submitted the Watford Local Development Framework Core Strategy to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government on 28 February 2012, for independent examination. Dates for the examination hearings will be published once known but are currently expected to take place in June 2012.

What is the Watford Local Development Framework Core Strategy?

The Core Strategy is an important component of the Watford Borough Council Local Development Framework (LDF). It sets out the long term vision of how Watford, and the places within it, should develop by 2031 and sets out the Council's strategy for achieving that vision. In particular, it identifies the broad locations for delivering housing and other strategic development needs such as employment, retail, leisure, community facilities and other uses. It also sets the context for the other policy documents that make up the Watford LDF. The Core Strategy covers the whole of the Borough of Watford.

Can I comment on the documents?

Pre-submission consultation on the Core Strategy took place during May and June 2011. As a result of comments received, changes were proposed which were subject to consultation during November and December 2011. All comments received at both of these stages will be considered by the inspector as part of the examination process, alongside further minor changes proposed by the Council in response. There is therefore no further opportunity to comment at this stage unless specifically invited to do so by the inspector.
