

Permit Parking Scheme Information.

A permit parking scheme is being considered based on feedback received which has indicated that non-residents are using the road for parking, preventing residents from parking. Responses that we receive to this consultation will inform if and how any permit scheme is implemented.

To ensure the parking is made available in the first instance for residents, permits will be issued. Vehicles belonging to residents or their visitors need to be identified by displaying a permit which will inform Enforcement Officers that such vehicles are allowed to park in this location during enforcement period.

Applying for a permit – for residents to purchase a permit the vehicle must be registered with the DVLA at the address for which the permit is required. We can issue a permit to a lease vehicle or company car, proof must be provided to show that the vehicle is leased to you in form of a lease agreement or letter on a headed paper from your company or leasing company.

Where can my visitors park? – Permits will be made available for residents to purchase and give to visitors to display in their vehicles whilst parked in a permit parking bay or place with the parking zone. All vehicles parked in the permit parking bay / place will need to display a valid permit otherwise a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) will be issued.

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| Residents Permits* | First permit = £35, second = £70 A maximum of 2 permits per household |
| Duplicate Residents Permit | £15 |
| Visitors Parking Vouchers | £15 per 20 half-day vouchers |
| Visitors Annual Permits | £70 |

Permit Charges

Vehicles allowed in parking bays / place – vehicle of any class, **not larger than 2.3 metres in height and 5.25 metres in length.*

Permit costs cover the initial setup of the scheme, on-going maintenance (lines and signs) and future reviews, administration of the scheme and its enforcement
