THE HERTSMERE BOROUGH COUNCIL (ALDENHAM ROAD AND BUSHEY HALL ROAD, BUSHEY) (PARKING PLACES) ORDER 202*

The Hertsmere Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council (“the County Council”) under Section 19 Local Government Act 2000 and Local Authorities (Arrangements for the Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 in exercise of the powers on the said County Council by Sections 32 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as “The Hertsmere Borough Council (Aldenham Road and Bushey Hall Road, Bushey) (Parking Places) Order 202*” and shall come into operation on **TBC**.
2. The Hertsmere Borough Council (Aldenham Road and Bushey Hall Road, Bushey) (Parking Places) Order 202* Plan numbered **MAP-AB1-24**, inclusive of the key, is incorporated into this Order, as listed in the Schedule to this Order.

3. **Interpretations –**

In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them;

“disabled person’s vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act 1984;

“disabled person’s badge” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“disabled person” means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

“key” means the key shown on the “on-street plan” to be read in conjunction with the “on-street plan”;

“On-Street Plan” means plan numbered **MAP-AB1-24** inclusive of its Key therein, which is incorporated into this Order as set out in Article 2 and the Schedule;

“parking disc” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“parking place” means any place where vehicles, or vehicles of any class, may wait as set out in s.32(4)(b) of the 1984 Act;

“postal packet” shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.

“provision of a universal postal service” shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.

“universal postal service” shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.

“relevant position” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

4. The lengths of road as shown on plan **MAP-AB1-24** and identified in the key to that plan as a parking place is hereby authorised for use as a parking place, operating 8.00am to 6.30pm on Monday to Saturday with a maximum stay of 1 hour and no return within 2 hours.
5. Save as provided in Articles 6 and 7 of this Order, where in Article 4 of this Order the lengths of road described as authorised for use as a parking place, operating 8.00am to 6.30pm on Monday to Saturday with a maximum stay of 1 hour and no return within 2 hours, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that parking place unless it is –
 - (a) Wholly parked within the marked limits of a parking bay; and
 - (b) Waiting for no more than 1 hour (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 2 hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
6. Subject to the provisions of this Order, parking places designated in the Schedule of this Order may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of vehicles of the following class, that is to say, motor vehicle or motor cycle (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.3 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.25 metres) and disabled person’s vehicles (on which must be displayed the relevant badge and disc).
7. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order applies in relation to -
 - (a) A vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (b) Anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed by Hertsmere Borough Council and as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004.
 - (c) A vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;

- (d) A vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
- (e) A marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may reasonably be necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

(2) The “purposes” referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are:

- (a) Any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) The removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) Constructing, improving, maintaining or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (e) The laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
8. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person’s vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road restricted by that Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hours from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
9. It shall not contravene Article 5 of this Order to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the parts of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable -
- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle
 - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
10. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person’s vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge, and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road restricted by that Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
11. (1) If a vehicle (other than a vehicle otherwise exempted by this Order) is left in contravention of any provision of this Order a penalty charge shall be payable.
- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge is payable, a penalty charge notice may be issued in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Road

Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022.

(3) The penalty charge shall be paid to the council in accordance with the instructions and within the time limits specified on the penalty charge notice.

12. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament:

13. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by any other enactment.

14. The provisions of the following Order are hereby revoked but only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order;
