THE HERTSMERE BOROUGH COUNCIL
(KEMP PLACE AND MONTAGUE HALL PLACE, BUSHEY)
(RESIDENTS PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2020 (AMENDMENT No.2) ORDER 2024

The Hertsmere Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Authorities (Arrangements for the Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51 and 53 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the provisions of Part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This order may be cited as “The Hertsmere Borough Council (Kemp Place and Montague Hall Place, Bushey) (Residents Parking Places) Order 2020 (Amendment No.2) Order 2024”, and shall come into operation on **TBC**
2. The provisions of The Hertsmere Borough Council (Kemp Place and Montague Hall Place, Bushey) (Resident Parking Places) Order 2020 shall be amended by inserting the following;

(a) 2(1) Interpretation

“Electronic Permits System” means a computerised system operated by or on behalf of the Council or its authorised agent, for the purpose of keeping a record of the registration marks of the vehicles in respect of which permits have been granted, the parking places in which such vehicles may be left and whether such permits are valid;

“Enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“Hand-held device” means Council approved equipment used by Civil Enforcement Officers which can transmit data to and receive data from the electronic permits system for the purpose of verifying if valid permits have been granted or issued in respect of vehicles waiting in any parking place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order;;

“Virtual Parking Permit” means a permit issued by the council in electronic format, not requiring same to be displayed in a vehicle.

(b) By inserting into Article 5 the following;

5 (c) or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid Parking Permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(c) By replacing Article 7 with the following;

7. Save as provided in Article 24 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the permitted hours on any parking place specified in Schedule 1 unless a valid Resident Parking Permit or Visitor Parking Permit is displayed on that vehicle in the relevant position, or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid Resident Parking Permit or Visitor Parking Permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle, in accordance of provisions of this Order.

(d) By replacing Article 8 with the following;

8. The absence of a Parking Permit on a vehicle left in a Parking Place or there being no indication on the hand-held device that a Parking Permit has been granted in respect of a vehicle left in a Parking Place shall be evidence of fact that a Parking Permit has not been issued to the owner or driver of the vehicle.

(e) In Articles 16(1), 16(2), 16(3) and 16(4) of that Order, for the text “shall be in writing” there were substituted the text “shall be in writing or electronic equivalent”;

(f) In Article 17 of that Order, after the words “The Exemption Permit shall be displayed in the relevant position” there were inserted the words “or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid exemption permit or staff permit has been granted in respect of that vehicle in form of a virtual parking permit”;

(g) In Article 20 to that Order, immediately following the text “Relevant Position” there were added the text “or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid Parking Permit has been granted”

(h) By replacing Article 20 (a) to that Order, immediately following the text “in the Relevant Position correctly marked in accordance with the instructions for validation on the front face” there were added the text “or there shall be an indication by hand-held device that a valid Parking Permit has been granted”.

(i) There were added to Article 21 the following;

21 (f) where a parking permit has been issued as a printed document a permit holder should not apply for the issue of a duplicate virtual

parking permit and vice versa. Upon such application the original parking permit will become invalid;

4. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
